Durga Puja: The light of hope and good wishes in front of Maa Durga. The biggest festival of Bengal - Durga Puja.


Diwali: Festival of lights, festival of happiness. The bird's eye view of Uttarpara, a historic town on the banks of river Hooghly (Ganges).

Navratri Golu: Festival of dolls

Navratri celebrated for nine nights during autumn of every year during which Golu (array of dolls) is set up as the representation of the assembly of Goddess Durga who set out to battle the demon Mahishasura for nine days, defeating him on the tenth day.

Golu also has the thematic representation of ancient stories depicting scenes from Ramayana and Mahabharatha among others.

In the evenings, women within the neighbourhood invite each other to visit their homes to view the Golu displays and sing devotional songs. They also exchange gifts and sweets.



Gokulashtami - Birthday of Sri Lord Krishna

Gokulashtami is the Hindu festival which celebrates the birth of Krishna, the eighth avatar of Lord Vishnu.

On this auspicious day, people decorate their houses, dress up little kids like baby Krishna and imprint the child's footprint from the door to the pooja room signifying the entering of Baby Krishna into their homes.

Jaipur Elephant Festival

A celebration of Royalty in Rajasthan. The Elephant festival is one of the most renowned festivals celebrated in the capital city of Rajasthan. Elephant is a symbol of royalty and thus is very significant to the royal culture of Rajasthan. The festival is celebrated every year in the month of March at the time of Holi.

Guru Purnima is an Indian festival dedicated to spiritual and academic teachers. This festival is celebrated on a full moon day (Purnima) in the Hindu month of Ashadha as it is known in the Hindu calendar of India (gu - Darkness or Ignorance, ru - Remover of darkness). This day (full moon) symbolises the removal of darkness by the light of knowledge.





Bathukamma

The unique festival of flowers in Telangana. Bathukamma is a colourful and vibrant flower festival celebrated predominantly by the Hindu women of Telangana. Bathukamma comes during the latter half of monsoon before the onset of winter. This festival celebrates the inherent relationship between earth, water and human beings.

Mattu Pongal

The third day of Pongal is dedicated to cattle and is called Mattu Pongal. Mattu Pongal is a day when cattle are given a well-deserved day of rest and given pride of place. On this day, people forget their caste, creed and other discrimination and come together to honour their cattle friends by celebrating it as a day of thanks-giving to them.
