## Egyptian PM commissions Sanmar plant in Port Said

Prime Minister of Egypt Ibrahim Mehleb was all praise for the large scale manufacturing facility set up by TCI Sanmar Chemicals in the country. The company has set up a huge chemical complex on Port Said that could provide employment to about 2,000 Egyptians directly and indirectly.

TCI Sanmar Chemicals has set up facility to manufacture 275,000 MT per annum of caustic soda, 60,000 MT per annum of green ethylene from ethanol and 200,000 MT per annum of poly vinyl chloride, in Port Said.

Sanmar Group has so far invested \$1.15 billion in the projects of TCI Sanmar. Additional investments of \$ 150 million in Phase 2 is planned, to set-up a new PVC plant with a capacity of 200,000 MT, and enhance the Ethylene manufacturing capacity by 60,000 MT. Thus after Phase 2 investment, the total investment will be \$1.3 billion which is the largest Indian investment in Chemical sector in Egypt.

Commissioning the plant on October 28, Mr Mehleb also underscored the commitment of the Egyptian government to resolve all issues faced by investors



# TCI Sanmar to invest \$150 m to expand Egypt chemical complex



Will set up new PVC unit; enhance ethylene manufacturing capacity

CHENNAI, OCTOBER 30: The Sanmar group, which has established a huge chemicals complex in Port Said, Egypt, TCI Sanmar Chemicals SAE, plans to invest an additional \$150 million in phase two of the project. This will involve setting up a new PVC plant with a capacity of two lakh tonnes and will also enhance its ethylene manufacturing capacity by 60,000 tonnes. After this round, the total investment will be \$1.3 billion (approximately \$17,800 crore), says a press release from the company.

Sanmar had acquired Trust Chemicals Industries in March 2007 and renamed it as TCI Sanmar Chemicals. In the first phase, its plan was to manufacture 2.75 lakh tonnescaustic soda, 60,000 tonnes of green ethylene from ethanol and two lakh tonnes PVC in a year. TCI Sanmar employs about 2,000 Egyptians directly and indirectly.

### Operating capacity

"The caustic soda plant is operating at around 90 per cent capacity while the PVC plant is operating at around 60 per cent capacity and will reach 100 per cent by March 15 when a new drier would have been commissioned. The Phase-II expansion work involving setting up another PVC plant of two lakh tonnes capacity (thus taking the total capacity to four lakh tonnes) and enhancing the ethanol to ethylene capacity to 1.2 lakh tonnes would involve an investment of \$150 million. We will start implementation of Phase-II after achieving financial closure for which we are working," said PS Jayaraman, Chairman, TCI Sanmar.

Recently, the Prime Minister of Egypt, Ibrahim Mehleb visited the plant along with Navdeep Suri, Indian Ambassador, and praised the scale of the Indian manufacturing facilities in Egypt, said the company. Sanmar's is the largest Indian investment in the country. The Prime Minister toured the premises, and received a briefing on the nature of the project, its contribution to the Egyptian economy and challenges to its growth. Indian investments in Egypt amount to more than \$2.5 billion across 50 different companies.

## Sanmar group plans to invest \$150 m more in Egyptian venture

CHENNAI: The Sanmar group is planning to inject additional investments into its Egyptian venture Trust Chemicals Industries of Egypt.

The city-based acquired Trust Chemicals in March 2007, and renamed it as TCI Sanmar Chemicals S.A.E.

The Sanmar group is planning an additional investment of \$150 million in the venture to set up a new PVC plant with a capacity of two lakh tonnes, and also to increase the ethylene manufacturing capacity by 60,000 tonnes.

The Sanmar group has so far invested \$1.15 billion in the projects of TCI Sanmar.

The fresh investment is part of the Phase-2 programme.

After Phase-2, the total investment of Sanmar will be around \$1.30 billion, claimed to be the largest Indian investment in the chemical sector in Egypt.

TCI Sanmar Chemicals S.A.E., Port Said, runs a chemical complex to manufacture 2.75 lakh tonnes annually of caustic soda, 60,000 tonnes annually of green ethylene from ethanol, and two lakh tonnes annually of polyvinyl chloride (PVC) in Port Said.

Prime Minister of Egypt Ibrahim Mehleb visited the plant on Tuesday and lauded the scale of operations, said a release.

Mr. Mehleb reiterated the commitment of the Egyptian government to resolve all issues faced by investors, the release added.



## Sanmar aims for increased Egyptian investments in Egypt

Company projects approximately \$1.3bn investment and \$150m injected into expansion of PVC production for 2015

PS Jayaraman, chairman of the Board of TCI Sanmar Chemicals, has revealed that a new unit will be added to expand the company's production of PCV, a material used in the plastic industries.

Jayaraman said the capacity of the unit is 200,000 tonnes annually, and will involve investments worth \$150m next year.

He added that the company currently has one unit that produces 200,000 tonnes of PVC annually. The two units will contribute a value of \$400m in hard currency to Egypt annually, which was previously spent on importing the material from abroad, he said.

Jayaraman said that the company's total investments in Egypt have reached \$1.15bn, representing the largest source of Indian investment in Egypt. The project is the largest of its kind in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region.

He added that after phase two investments are provided for the PVC plan, total investments will reach \$1.2bn.

The company currently produces 275,000 tonnes of caustic soda annually, in addition to 60,000 tonnes of green ethylene, 200,000 tonnes of ethanol, and 200,000 tonnes of PVC.





# TCI Sanmar Chemicals to expand Egyptian operations

TCI Sanmar Chemicals is planning to expand its operations in Egypt with an investment of \$150m.

The Port Said complex currently produces 275,000t of caustic soda, 60,000t of green ethylene from ethanol and 200,000t of PVC each year.

PVC is used as a raw material in a wide range of products, including pipes, cables, upholstery, door and window profiles.

The expansion will increase ethylene and PVC output at the complex to 400,000t and 120,000t respectively.

"The Port Said complex currently produces 275,000t of caustic soda, 60,000t of green ethylene from ethanol and 200,000t of PVC each year."

TCI Sanmar chairman Jayaraman said: "We will start implementation of Phase II after achieving financial closure, which we are working on."

The proposed project will increase Sanmar's total investment to date in Egypt to \$1.3bn, which is said to be the largest-of-its kind in the country's chemical segment.

Indian ambassador Navdeep Suri said: "Indian companies like the Sanmar group have demonstrated their willingness and ability to undertake major investments in Egypt. Their success will encourage other Indian companies to do the same."

Sanmar acquired Trust Chemical Industries in 2007 and renamed it TCI Sanmar Chemicals. The company has a workforce of about 2,000, which includes direct and indirect jobs in the region.
